MINISTRY UPDATE

Union Jal Shakti Minister's Call for an Hour of 'Shramdaan for Swachhata' - October 2, 2024





n a nationwide appeal, Union Minister for Jal Shakti, Shri C.R. Paatil, invited citizens from all walks of life to participate in an hour of 'Shramdaan for Swachhata' on October 2, 2024, from 9:00 AM to 10:00 AM. This initiative encourages community engagement in cleanliness activities and aligns with the Swachh Bharat Diwas celebrations, led by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. The event aims to highlight India's progress in sanitation, showcasing innovative solutions like waste-to-energy initiatives and climate-resilient sanitation infrastructure.

During a press briefing, Hon'ble Minister Paatil emphasized the significant achievements of the Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM), noting that over 55% of villages have been declared 'ODF Plus Model.' He highlighted that nearly 40,000 kilometers of rural roads have been constructed using plastic waste, demonstrating a commitment to sustainable practices in waste management. Swachh Bharat Diwas will serve as a moment of reflection on the mission's ten-year journey,

recognizing contributions from global influencers and community members.


Ms. Vini Mahajan, the then Secretary of the Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation, reiterated the importance of collective support from all sectors of society, emphasizing that sanitation is a shared responsibility. She reported on SBM's remarkable progress, including five lakh operational waste collection vehicles and the implementation of plastic waste management strategies in 3,000 blocks across the country.

The culmination of the SHS 2024 campaign on Gandhi Jayanti showcased significant milestones achieved, with approximately 25 lakh events organized and over 20 crore participants engaged nationwide. The campaign has seen active involvement from state governments, local authorities, and community groups, reinforcing the theme 'Swabhav Swachhata, Sanskar Swachhata,' which promotes a whole-of-society approach to cleanliness.



MINISTRY UPDATE

5th National Water Awards, 2023: Celebrating Excellence in Water Conservation - October 22, 2024



On October 22, 2024, the Hon'ble President of India, Smt. Droupadi Murmu, conferred the 5th National Water Awards, 2023, at a ceremony held at Vigyan Bhawan in New Delhi. This prestigious event recognized 38 winners across nine categories for their outstanding contributions to water conservation and management, with each recipient receiving a citation, trophy, and cash prizes in select categories.

The ceremony commenced with a traditional 'Jal Kalash' ceremony, emphasizing the significance of water. In her

address, President Murmu commended the awardees, asserting that their contributions serve as an inspiration for future generations. She underscored the success of initiatives like the Jal Jeevan Mission, aimed at providing safe drinking water to all citizens, and advocated for every household to implement a Rain Water Harvesting Structure (RWHS).

Hon'ble Union Minister for Jal Shakti, Shri C.R. Paatil, expressed gratitude to the award winners for their impactful work in water management, stating that the

awards foster a healthy competitive environment within the sector. He congratulated Odisha for securing the first place in the best state category, while Uttar Pradesh and Gujarat were recognized for second place, with Puducherry sharing third. The achievements of these states serve as inspiration for others engaged in water management efforts.

Smt. Vini Mahajan, the then Secretary of the Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation, highlighted the Ministry's commitment to transforming water conservation into a public movement. She outlined key government initiatives such as Jal Jeevan Mission, Namami Gange, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, and Atal Bhujal Yojana, all aimed at enhancing water security and accessibility across the country.

In her concluding remarks, Smt. Debashree Mukherjee, Secretary of the Department of Water Resources, RD & GR, thanked the President for inaugurating the event and announced the forthcoming 6th National Water Awards, 2024, urging increased participation from the media and stakeholders.

A notable highlight of the ceremony was the launch of the book "Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Best Practices," which showcases effective water conservation initiatives undertaken by various stakeholders across India.

The achievements of the award winners were exemplary. Odisha, the first prize winner, reported the creation of over 53,000 rainwater harvesting structures, 10,800 reuse and recharge structures, and 21,000 wastewater treatment plants. Uttar Pradesh provided tap water to over 1.91 crore households under the Jal Jeevan Mission, completed 133 Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs), and established 14,679 Amrit Sarovars.

In the best district category, Banda in Uttar Pradesh, a joint winner, rejuvenated approximately 400 ponds and constructed 460 check dams. Ganderbal in Jammu and Kashmir, also a joint winner, undertook maintenance of 400 km of canals. In Madhya Pradesh, Indore constructed 420 farm ponds and renovated 103 water bodies. Meanwhile, Visakhapatnam in Andhra Pradesh restored 33 water bodies and built 2,400 artificial recharge structures.

The 5th National Water Awards highlight the critical role of water conservation in sustainable development. By recognizing the achievements of these distinguished awardees, the Ministry of Jal Shakti aims to inspire collective action toward a water-secure India, emphasizing collaboration among government bodies, local communities, and civil society in promoting responsible water stewardship nationwide.




Strengthening Healthcare Infrastructure in Liberia: WAPCOS Signs Agreement for Supervision of New Redemption Hospital - October 1,


Foundation Stone Laid by Hon'ble Prime Minister for Eklavya Model Residential Schools in Jharkhand and Meghalaya - October 2, 2024



The ceremony marks a significant step towards empowering tribal students through enhanced educational facilities.

The four new EMRS locations include:

- 1. Bano, District Simdega, Jharkhand
- 2. Kuchai, District Saraikela Kharsawan, Jharkhand
- 3. Nongstoin, District West Khasi Hills, Meghalaya
- 4. Tikrikilla, District West Garo Hills, Meghalaya

WAPCOS is executing the construction of 45 EMRS for the National Educational Society for Tribal Students (NESTS) under the Ministry of Tribal Affairs. Each school is designed to accommodate 480 students and includes comprehensive facilities such as boys' and girls' hostels, warden residences, 26 staff quarters, a principal's residence, and sports amenities like archery grounds, running tracks, and basketball and volleyball courts. These EMR Schools aim to create an inclusive, nurturing environment for tribal students to pursue academic and athletic excellence.




High-Level Visit to Rwanda's Irrigation and Watershed Development Projects - October 5, 2024

On October 5th, His Excellency Mridu Pawan Das, High Commissioner of India to Rwanda, visited the Mpanga, Mahama Lot-1 & Lot-2 Irrigation and Watershed Development projects in Rwanda. He was accompanied by Sh. Vinod Kumar, HOC, and Sh. Gurnam Singh Sodhi, Country Manager, WAPCOS. These projects form an essential part of the Export Targeted Modern Irrigated Agriculture (ETI) Project, financed by a \$120.05 million Line of Credit from Exim Bank of India.






CMD's Visit to Vidhan Sabha Construction Site at Nava Raipur, Chhattisgarh - October 18, 2024








Inauguration of Kabu-16 Hydro Electric Project in Burundi October 25, 2024


